

A Folly Farewell

"Super Dave's Parking Lot Bash, Honey" to pay tribute to longtime Folly resident

olly Beach is beloved not just for its Bohemian surfer vibe, but for the unique characters that make up the fabric of it. David "Super Dave" Beltzhoover was in that number.

A resident for more than 20 years, he would wake up every day, play beach volleyball and then show up at exactly 2 p.m. for his shift at a parking lot behind Rita's Seaside Grill, always with a huge smile on his face and donning a Folly Beach T-shirt, his personal preferred uniform.

"He loved welcoming people and being an ambassador of Folly," said his daughter Hailee Zuniga, with whom he was very close. "He worked seven days a week. It's what he loved to do and that filled his life. He was a very simple man. He had fifty Folly Beach T-shirts, lived in a rented house and had a little old golf cart."

Haillee recalls how her dad, originally from Pennsylvania, first moved to the area working in construction following a hurricane, rebuilding the Folly Beach community.

"Super Dave" first lived on James Island and eventually moved into an apartment on Folly Beach behind the Circle K and then into an apartment on East Ashley Avenue and thrived as a parking lot attendant.

Hailee visited her dad every summer since she was eight years old on Folly Beach, staying at the Folliday Inn hotel on West Ashley Avenue.

Her next trip to Folly Beach is a heartbreaking turn of events: it will be to attend a community event celebrating the life and legacy of her dad, who tragically died in late April at age 61 following a fire at his apartment.

"This was the most horrible thing that could ever happen ever in my life," Hailee said.

The tragic loss left

a huge hole in the Folly Beach community among those who knew Super Dave and shared a smile

with him on a daily basis. Memorials were "He just knew everybody on Folly, he left at his home: photos, flowers, tributes to couldn't go into a place without someone his favorite NFL team, the Chicago Bears, saying, 'Hey, Dave,'" Hailee said. and even his preferred beverages that got

> "He loved meeting people; he called everyone 'honey,'" Hailee said.

> From 12-4 p.m., the community is welcome to come celebrate and honor the life of a true Folly Beach personality who lived life with wholehearted enthusiasm. There will be sweet treats and printed photos from throughout Super Dave's life.

"We're going to hang photos on a clothesline so people will be able to walk around and see his life," Hailee said.

> The family is working on ways people can donate to Surfers Healing, one of Super Dave's favorite non-profit organizations, in his honor.

Hailee said the outpouring of love and support for the family following the tragedy further cemented Folly Beach as the supportive and closeknit community her father loved so deeply.

"When we down there, people and restaurants brought food to our house. I was distraught, and people just kept coming to where I was sitting outside my dad's house, bringing flowers and putting a hand on me and saying, 'We love you," Hailee recalls. "Nobody let me feel alone the whole time. It was magical."

"Super Dave's Parking Lot Bash, Honey" will be held in the parking lot behind Rita's Seaside Grill on Saturday, Sept. 7 from 12-4 p.m. There will be BBQ a beer truck and music with The Shakin' Martinis from 12:30 -3:30 p.m.

July 30

ASSAULT AND BATTERY

Officers were called about a fight at a local hotel pool and officers observed a man sitting on a lounge chair with a severely bloody face. Multiple witnesses told officers that the suspect was a couple with a small dog and said the suspects had walked on the beach towards the Folly Beach County Park. EMS was called for the injured man who was transported to a local hospital with a fractured orbital bone under his left eye fractured, nasal bone and open lacerations around his left eye. It was determined that the male couple had punched the victim in the face multiple times. After locating the couple, the man resisted arrest, elbowing officers and attempted to punch officers in the face. The man broke away and started running on the beach with officers deployed tasers, the first which was unsuccessful. the second effective with the man falling onto the sand. Yet, the man continued to pull away from officers and start to roll on the sand and was able to get his feet and run away through beach access. The female suspect was arrested on scene. The woman identified the fugitive man by name only and said she did not know his date of birth or any other information, although officers discovered that the couple were married. Inside the couples' bag officers found a plastic bag of marijuana, an open container of yodka and three beer cans. While completing paperwork, the woman's cell phone rang and officers copied the phone number and answered and spoke to a man who reported that the suspect approached

him asking for a ride off the island and the man provided the ride and dropped him off near the bridge near Crosby's Seafood. As of July 31, the suspect was still at large and multiple arrest warrants were issued, including assault-first-degree, resisting arrest, public intoxication. The small dog was placed in the Folly Beach public safety kennel. According to Charleston County arrest records, the 31-year-old man was booked on August 7. Arrest records show the 43-year old woman was additionally charged on August 15 with interference and hindering officers and giving false information to police.

August 1

LOITERING

Officers were on patrol on Center Street around 6 a.m. after a business owner said employees found subject sleeping on the back patio. Officers located as a subject sleeping on a bench and woke the subject up and asked him what he was doing. The man said he worked for a nearby restaurant and spoke very little English and Google translate was used to communicate. The man said he did not have any identification. He was arrested for loitering.

August 2

ASSAULT

Around 7:30 p.m. officers were called to the Folly Beach Pier about an assault that occurred between two males. Officers located the victim who said he was sitting underneath the pier at a table reading a book when an unknown male approached him and punched him in the face. The victim had a small laceration above his eyebrow. He said he had never seen the man before and gave officers a description of what he was wearing. The suspect, a 42-yearold Ohio man matching the description, approached officers and asked if they were looking for him. When officers asked him what happened, the suspect said the victim "showed him the business." It is unclear what that means. He was arrested for assault.

August 8

THEFT

A couple walked into Folly Beach headquarters and said they hired a dogsitter from a next door app, a woman who agreed to stay at the home. There were multiple cameras of the interior and exterior of the home. The homeowners noticed that the woman left for several hours on end leaving the dog alone, which prompted the homeowner to text her and ask where she was. After several exchanges and ignored messages, the homeowners told the sitter they no longer requested her services and to leave the property. Camera footage showed the dog sitter returning to the residence and the homeowners asked a neighbor to go over and ask the sitter to leave. The neighbor said the woman's boyfriend was inside the master bedroom. The homeowners said the sitter left a number of clothing and make up items behind and they were missing a bottle of oxycodone and hydrocodone and an heirloom nightgown had been taken from the bedroom closet.

August 10

ANIMAL CRUELTY

Officers issued a citation to a woman who left her dog inside of her vehicle with no A/C running and the windows cracked halfway down. A concerned citizen called in the situation and said the woman left her dog in the car to go surf. Officers arrived at 9:30 a.m. and noted the temperature was 84° with a heat index of 94°. Officers removed the dog from the vehicle and transported it to public safety headquarters and left a business card for the owner. An hour later, a woman called to say she was on her way to get her dog. She was cited for animal cruelty.

August 10

DISORDERLY CONDUCT

Officers arrested a 53-year-old woman for disorderly conduct after several concerned bar patrons said the woman was acting erratically, possibly intoxicated and attempting to drive. Officers found the woman, who had a cat with her, matching the description who appeared to be intoxicated and got very upset and confrontational with officers. She told officers she was "just a crazy white woman" going through a tragic life event and was going to her friend's house. She then said her friend lived on a sailboat "down yonder," but would not give officers the exact location. She was arrested and the cat was taken to the Folly Beach kennel.

August 15

POINTING A PISTOL

A man reported that around 12:30 p.m., he

noticed a vehicle heading onto Folly Beach that was swerving into the opposite lane on Folly Road. When the concerned citizen pulled up next to the vehicle to get the driver's attention and "throw his hands up at him," he said the driver, approximately 80 years of age, pulled out a handgun and presented it at him through the vehicle. The citizen said the driver then pulled behind his vehicle and proceeded to follow too closely, waving the pistol in the air for him to see. Officers patrolled the area and found a vehicle matching the description at a residence and found the registered owner, an 84 year-old man who has no prior criminal history. The case is ongoing.

August 19

INFORMATION

A woman reported that around 6 p.m. she was walking on East Ashley Ave. when males from a vehicle threw an empty beer box at her, striking her on the side of the head. The woman said that before striking her, a vehicle passed her then slowed down and the occupants asked her if she wanted a ride and when she said no, the suspects cursed at her and threw the empty box at her. It was noted that the woman was highly intoxicated and had been involved in an earlier, separate incident report that day, but had been cleared.

August 19


ASSAULT

Officers were dispatched to an area following reports of two groups fighting. Officers met with three men who were standing in the driveway of a home. The group told officers that they were walking down the street when a vehicle with several suspects pulled up to them and started a verbal dispute and one of the men mentioned they wanted to fight, causing them to stop their vehicle. All the suspects got out of the vehicle and started getting aggressive, and the parties continued to have a verbal dispute. An officer and one of the men on foot got jumped by several men and had several abrasions on his back and shoulder and a laceration on his nose. There was cell phone footage of part of the altercation. Officers canvassed the area circular the area for any vehicle that matched the description. The vehicle (identified by the license plate) was last seen heading off the island.





Tourist season comes to a close and festival season begins on Folly

wo years ago, the Folly Association of Business (FAB) set out to create a family-friendly festival around Labor Day to celebrate the end of the tourist season and head into fall. The creation of the first-ever Mermaids & Mateys Festival in 2022 was a huge success, with food and drinks, arts and crafts, fashion vendors, live music on multiple stages, a huge kids area, and a costume contest. However, last year's Mermaids & Mateys was shelved because of all the Folly's 50th Birthday celebrations. But this month, it returns with even more activities and fun for the whole family over the course of two days.

The festivities start at 10 a.m. on Saturday, Sept. 28, known as "Salty Saturday," whith the closure of Center Street, which will be lined with food and craft vendors. (The streets will close at 7 a.m. and reopen at 6 p.m. but are open to the public from 10 a.m. – 4 p.m.). There will be live music on three stages (Main stage, Erie stage, and Huron stage) with Longshot Gamble, Southbound 17 Fancy Koolaid, and Kevin West. FAB event coordinator Kelly Travers says the main afternoon act remains a surprise, but she promises it's a new and exciting group. Additionally, the street festival will include a costume contest and a dunk tank. Plus, a "Loot Route" scavenger hunt, including cocktails, secret finds around Folly, and more.

"You will see a mix of celebrating our seaside culture while also mixing in some fall/spooky vibes for our guests," says Travers. "We are excited to introduce a bulked-up crew of mermaids and mateys! They will be available for brunch, to greet guests, etc. There will be an awesome Instagram-worthy photo area. So, get ready for some new fun twists for this street closure!"



The fun continues on Sunday, Sept. 29 with the sand sculpting competition, which was moved from Sea & Sand to Mermaids & Mateys because of the beach renourishment project. The sand sculpting will take place from 11 a.m.-2:30 p.m. in front of Tldes. hotel

Travers says her favorite part of the festival is seeing everyone embracing the theme of this event. "We will see mermaids and mateys of all ages out having fun and celebrating our transition into fall," she

says. "Also, we're excited to be donating a portion of our proceeds to the Charleston Alzheimer's walk."

Mermaids and Mateys will be held Sept. 28-29. Admission is free for Folly residents with ID and \$10 in advance, \$15 at the door for non-residents. Kids 12 and under are free. Conditions are Ideal for Great Fishing in September

ith an ideal set of conditions in place, anglers can be sure that inshore fishing will really pick up in September. The combination of lots of bait, cooler water temperatures and less traffic on the water should make for awesome fishing. While a lot of people will turn their focus to hunting and football, fishermen who save some time for casting a line will be well rewarded.

During this time of year, redfish will begin to increasingly take artificial baits. Plastic lures that mimic the bait fish in our waters are very effective. Zman's 3 %-inch Streakz in smokey shad is a great choice. I pair this lure with a 1/8-ounce jighead but conditions

may call for a heavier weight. Make sure to change your rate of retrieve as you fish a spot. Sometimes just slowing down or speeding up the pace of the lure can make the bite come to life.

Even with artificials becoming more effective, keep throwing those popping corks. Mud minnows, live shrimp and artificial shrimp have been working well when suspended about 18"-24" below the cork. Trout and redfish alike will eat these baits as they pass by suspended in the water column. Corks have been working best fished over shell rake and along grassy banks at mid and high tide.

It's not uncommon to catch bull redfish (36" inches plus) during the summer time at the jetties or at nearshore reefs. During the fall, these big fish come into the harbor and inlets as they track down large mullet and menhaden. Rods rigged for these fish will have heavy test braided line connected to a 50-60lb. leader and 7/0 circle hooks. Fresh chunks of mullet, menhaden or smaller fish are effective baits. Target spots where there are marked changes in depth and wait for your rod to rip over!






